Designed for children entering first grade through the sixth grade as of Fall, 2006. The focus is on small group enrichment led by a certified teaching staff. The curriculum includes skill development focused on a variety of academic areas including math, writing, reading and language arts. Special activities include foreign language workshops with cooking and cultural exposure.

The emphasis will be on learning in a fun, hands-on environment. This program is designed for children who wish to expand their knowledge of reading, writing and math. Students must display an age-appropriate level of independence to participate in Learning Connections at Longfellow.

Camp Dates, Hours & Fees

There are three 2-week sessions:

- July 5-14 (no camp July 3rd and 4th)
- July 17-28
- July 31-August 11

Children must be enrolled for two consecutive weeks.

Camp hours are Monday-Friday, 8:45 am-1:00 pm.

Camp tuition is \$630 per 2-week session. For the July 5-14 session, tuition is \$515.

Learning Connections at Longfellow is held at the Longfellow Children's Center, located directly across the parking lot from The Longfellow Club.

Extended Care

Extended care until 4:00 pm is available for \$330/session (\$265 for Session 1). From 1:00-4:00, campers join Camp Longfellow programming. Additional care is available until 6:00 pm for an additional fee. Contact Karen Mahoney for details.
